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CalStar and MedJet

At the September meeting, the topic of emergency service providers came up. The two that are most familiar to members are MedJetAssist and Cal Star.

MedJetAssist is an air medical transport membership program for travelers. If you are hospitalized 150 miles or more from home, MedjetAssist will arrange air medical transport all the way back to your hospital of choice in your home country, and at no cost besides your membership fee. They offer different types of memberships, including a motorcycle membership (an add-on to any membership). The motorcycle program provides up to \$3,500 for return of the enrolled motorcycle per membership period to the dealership or shop of the member's choice, but this is limited to North America, and is not applicable to rental bikes. It also offers return of the motorcycle if the member is treated on an outpatient basis, but is diagnosed by a medical physician as physically unable to ride. An example of the annual cost for an individual under the age of 75 for domestic travel, and medical transfer only, would be \$185. See their site here: medjetassist

CalStar is now a part of AirMedCare Network. This network is an alliance of affiliated air ambulance providers (each is a separate Company). Network membership enrolls you in each Company's membership program. Membership ensures the patient



will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Company by providing prepaid protection against a Company's air ambulance costs that are not covered by a member's insurance or other benefits or third party responsibility. Members are entitled to transport (when available) by an AirMedCare Network provider to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions deemed bv an attending medical professional to be lifeor limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability. There is no limit to the number of transports a member may take in a year, but the transports are limited to life-or limb-threatening AirMedCare emergencies. Network operates only in the US. The annual fee is \$65.

Motorcycling in Santa Barbara County



This book was brought to the September meeting by Phil. Here is a synopsis of the book:

Starting in the early 1900s, Santa Barbara County became home to over a dozen motorcycle racecourses. Not one of those battlegrounds survives today. Pershing Park once had a stadium, Elings Park on Las Positas Road was Veronica Springs Hill Climb Course, and before that, La Conchita was home to hill climbing and TT events. Motorcycling in Santa Barbara County will take the readers back in time to the glory days of two wheels on city streets and engage them in competition at its racetracks. Preserved in these pages are the firsthand stories of the men that competed on these courses as far back as 1924.

Author Ed Langlo is a third-generation Santa Barbaran. His father joined the Santa Barbara Motorcycle Club in 1936 and campaigned Santa Barbara's first 80cubic-inch Harley-Davidson at its race events. While listening to the stories and recollections of his father's surviving friends, Ed Langlo vowed to preserve this part of history on film as well as in print. Co-author Tony Baker is an amateur historian with three Arcadia publications to his credit. Baker lives in Ventura, California, and is involved in motorsports archiving

This museum has a collection of over 600 artifacts relating to historical transportation. Included in the collection automobiles, are steam locomotives, bicycles, toys, and, of course, motorcycles. They were mostly old Indians and Hondas. One unique motorcycle was a feet-forward Ner-A-Car. type of а motorcycle. Ner-A-Cars were in production from 1921 to 1927. This one was a 3wheeler:



Another interesting museum is the Wings Over the Rockies Air & Space Museum, with over 4 dozen aircraft and space vehicles.
