Highway Closures

Heavy rains caused the **Pfeiffer Canyon Bridge** in Big Sur to crack and start sinking into the mountainside. The bridge was closed to pedestrians and vehicles on February 15th and may be closed for up to six months, or more. Southbound travelers can only go as far on State Route 1 from Carmel to just south of Palo Colorado in Monterey County. Northbound travelers can only go as far as Cambria to Ragged Point.

Note that State Route 1 is closed northbound and southbound at Ragged Point Inn due to mud slides and is expected to open on March 20th. There are several other closures on State Route 1 at this time but they are expected to be open at various times in March.

Highway 33 is open.

Hover Ride Concept Andrew Hard

Sometimes the best ideas come from unexpected places. Back in January, Lego Technic released a 603-piece creation for BMW's R 1200 GS Adventure, a dual-sport motorcycle that's as comfortable on dirt as it is on tarmac. After some tinkering, Lego discovered the same 603 pieces could be



reconfigured into a futuristic flying motorbike, and BMW took notice. The automaker — specifically a training unit called the BMW Junior Company — took Lego's design and transformed it into a full-size aerial motorcycle called the Hover Ride Concept. Now *that's* thinking outside the box. The technology to make it fly safely is unfortunately several years out, but as a mode of future transport, the concept certainly looks the part.

The bike is sleek, sharp, and quite frankly cool as hell, and we can already imagine squads of robotic policemen using it to swarm baddies from above. To make it "air-worthy," BMW transformed the front-wheel rim into a propeller and added a hover unit under the seat, but unfortunately, the brand has no plans to produce it. At least not right now...
