There did not seem to be many motorcycle trips in November/December. Club members did go on some non-motorcycle trips, however.


Steve and **Fran** traveled to Death Valley for some truck camping and exploring.

Maps for Motorcyclists

Everyone probably uses GPS these days, but some of us (maybe more than we think) still use or have paper maps as a back-up to the GPS or phone. A paper map gives you the big picture in a way that a GPS cannot necessarily do—and they work without batteries!

There are several maps made specifically for motorcyclists (and bicyclists) that focus on scenic routes, less-travelled routes, places of interest, camping spots and local food venues—all things of relevance for two-wheeled travelers.

MAD Maps has a multitude of maps to include almost all of the US states, plus specific routes such as Route 66, Pacific Coast Highway, the Southwest, and a "scenic roads" collection.

Butler Maps has a series of state maps (paved roads), regional maps (paved roads), and Backcountry Discovery Routes (dirt roads). Butler also offers DVD's and books to supplement or accompany the maps. Butler Maps

Adventure Cycling Association makes maps for bicycle travel, but these maps show a level of detail that is also suitable for motorcycle travelers. The maps do not cover states specifically, but cover various routes, including coast-to-coast, Route 66, Great Parks, Atlantic Coast, and Pacific Coast. The routes do not seek out curvy roads, in general, but they focus on smaller roads with less traffic. Campsites are clearly marked. Adventure Cycling Maps

Another—and local—source of Michelin European maps is Santa Barbara bookstore **Chaucer's** (3321 State Street).

For our trip planning, I like to use the Michelin North America Road Atlas. These maps are arranged not by state, but by direction, so it's easy to get an overview of the route on sequential pages. BMW MOA National Rally Registration

Early registration for the BMW MOA National Rally in Great Falls, Montana is now open. From January 1 until February 15, MOA member registration is \$55; two people registered for the rally is \$99. The second person does not need to be a MOA member.

Starting February 16, the standard preregistration price applies and it is \$65 for members and \$85 for guests. Then, starting on June 1, standard gate pricing is in effect: \$85 for members and \$105 for guests.
