### **Member News and Rides**

The March meeting at the Creekside had about 24 attendees. In addition to the Technical Topic by Steve, several upcoming events were also discussed.

**Deb, Steve, Fran, Phil** and **Tanja** are planning on attending the 49er Rally.

**Chuck** has reserved a spot for 15 tents at the MOA National Rally in Redmond, OR, June 13-15. The 49er Rally, in Mariposa, CA, is May 23-27, so some members may be going to the 49er Rally on their way to the National.

**Cody** has planned for a campout at Carrizo Plain, April 19-21. The campsite is KCL Campground, where we have camped before. More information on Page 4.

**Chuck** has planned a Club event at the Hacienda Lodge at Fort Hunter-Liggett, May 3-5. More information on Page 4.

**Oscar** talked about a possible late summer or early fall Club event: Riding the Sierra passes, which generally are only open in mid-to late summer, especially this year!

There are 5 passes that cross from the eastern side to the western side: Tioga Pass, Sonora Pass, Monitor Pass, Ebbetts Pass and Carson Pass. They could be ridden in 3-4 days to make a long weekend of it. Oscar suggested spending one night in Fresno, then one night in Lee

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Vining, then one night in Angels Camp, then one night in Kirkwood.

Steve suggested staying in one place, for example, Sonora, and use that as a base camp for the pass riding. Sonora has a number of hotels and restaurants. Other towns in the Sierra foothills are also possible places to use as a base camp.

This plan is still in the development stage, so start thinking about more specific dates and logistics.

# Technical Topic: Numb Hands

Steve started this discussion by mentioning that he just thought having numb hands was part of motorcycling—but, it turns out, it is not necessarily so! If the nerves in your hands or elbow are compressed, then you will experience hand numbness. The two nerves affected are the radial and ulnar nerves in the hands. Having your arms straight in front of you is usually okay, but if your arms are locked, then the nerves can be compressed. Putting weight on the hands also compresses the nerves.

Marten mentioned that pressure from the wind can cause you to bend your neck, and then you can get numb hands from that. A windshield can help significantly with neck and hand problems. Risers can also help.

Oscar said that the right type of gloves has made a difference for him. But gloves with plastic finger protectors can also contribute to numbness, so be aware of that aspect.

Michael added that wrist rockers can help, too, as you can rest your hand on the platform.

And, as always, stopping and taking a break can help with hand numbness, sore necks, road fatigue, sleepiness and empty stomachs. You might also find some scenery to enjoy.

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### **Road Updates**

**Highway 1:** Well, to absolutely no one's surprise, Highway 1 is still not open, and now has some additional closures. The section at Paul's Slide remains closed, with the northbound direction closed at Limekiln State Park. Regent's Slide closes the road sections between Big Creek Reserve and Esalen. Rocky Creek Slide closes the road south of Palo Colorado Road and north of Bixby Bridge Creek.

In other words, don't bother trying to ride the section of Highway 1 between Cambria and Monterey (unless you just want to ride to Ragged Point for lunch).

**Highway 33:** Wayne and I just drove Highway 33 about 2 weeks ago, and it is open. There are five one-way controlled traffic, single-lane sections, with wait times varying between 3 minutes maximum to 15 minutes maximum. Traffic level was very light on a Friday afternoon.

**Nacimiento Fergusson Road:** Construction is currently in process. It may be open by August 2024. Photo below shows some of the construction.

#### **Carrizo Plains Roundup**

Ride out for two nights in Carrizo Plains National Monument at KCL Campground, April 19<sup>th</sup> through the 21<sup>st</sup>. This vast grassland offers miles of flower blooms, dirt roads of all difficulties, the San Andreas fault, a soda lake, and wildlife, including antelope and elk, if you can find them. The surrounding area also has amazing riding opportunities in Los Padres National Forest. Come "hear the silence," and bring a tent and a chair for the campfire. The sites are first come first serve; we will try to grab several to have room for everyone. There is water and vault toilets at the campground.

For the low price of \$50, Friday and Saturday night dinner will be provided with a light breakfast Saturday and Sunday morning, depending on the libations consumed the night before. Alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks will be provided. A short ride away, lunch dining opportunities can be found in the nearby towns of Taft, Pine Mountain Club, and New Cuyama.

From the south, there are 19 miles of hard-pack gravel road and possibly slow-moving sightseers enjoying the flower blooms. From Highway 58 in the north, there are 7 miles of hard-pack gravel road to the campground.

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


The mysterious sailing stones are at the south end of the playa. Their trails were long, rarely straight, and sometimes going different directions. The whole experience on this playa is otherworldly.
